Porthmadog Area Councillors' Group, jointly with key partners such as Cymdeithas Tai Eryri, Gofal a Thrwsio Gwynedd, Age Cymru, Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board and Cartrefi Cymunedol Gwynedd; who collaborated with Gwynedd Council to undertake an assessment of the accommodation and care needs of older people in the area. The assessment has highlighted the needs of older people that include many aspects such as housing options, assistance to live at home, opportunities to socialise and residential care. The Group also acknowledged that there is no future for Hafod y Gest Residential Home in its current form, but recommended that this would be the best site for any future development for older people.

The consultation process provides guidance for the Council, taking into account the need to transform the service from using traditional residential homes to using Extra Care Housing. Extra Care Housing offers alternative opportunities for older people to continue to retain their independence with the assurance that 24 hour support is at hand should it be required.

6) PARTICIPATION AND CONSULTATION

What participation and consultation exercises have been conducted in relation to the policy / service / function and what was the outcome?

During the period leading up to the creation of this report and recommendation, the Council has:

- Engaged with the public to undertake a care and accommodation needs assessment in the Porthmadog area in order to identify future needs.
- Collaborated with the Porthmadog Area Councillors' Group, along with key partners such as Cymdeithas Tai Eryri, Gofal a Thrwsio Gwynedd, Age Cymru, Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board and Cartrefi Cymunedol Gwynedd, to draw-up possible options for the provision of accommodation and care for the future.
- Engaged with key stakeholders to inform them of the recommendation to be made on the future of Hafod y Gest Residential Home. (Note that the stakeholders include staff members and users of Hafod y Gest Residential Home and Noddfa Madog Day Centre, families, Cyfeillion Hafod y Gest, local councillors and Union representatives).

Should a recommendation be made to commence a consultation process, the measures noted below will be in place to support stakeholders during the consultation:

- An information pack on the consultation, which notes the background and sets the situation in its context.
- Individual meetings with service users and their families.
- Provision of independent advocacy for users, access to a social worker and the MEDRA Counselling Service.
- Meetings with staff.
- Support for staff provided by the Human Resources Department, as

well as the MEDRA Counselling Service.

- Formal and informal meetings with statutory and voluntary bodies and establishments which have an interest in the care sector.
- Hold a dialogue with elected representatives.
- A Council Officer available at specific times to receive the comments of local people.

7) AVAILABLE EVIDENCE

All research into the older people accommodation field, including the Assessment of the care and accommodation needs of the Porthmadog area, shows that older people wish to remain in their own homes.

Extra Care Housing offers this option, with assurance that assistance would be available if required.
