# 2. POLISI CRONFA BENSIWN GWYNEDD

- **2.1** The fund has a Statement of Investment Principles which sets the framework for the fund's investments. The revised Statement for adoption is included as an item on this agenda.
- The Statement includes social, environmental and ethical matters in paragraph 6. This outlines the responsibilities of the pension fund as follows:

With regard to socially responsible investment, the Committee is mindful of legal principles which are based on decisions in the courts and which apply to all pension schemes. In particular the administering authorities are not entitled to subordinate the interests of members to social, environmental and ethical demands. The financial performance of the Fund consistent with proper diversification and prudence, is paramount.

2.3 It is difficult to choose a specific area that the fund will not invest in as there is a requirement to conform with the principle in paragraph 2.2 and everyone will have their own view of acceptable and unacceptable areas.
