Question 1: How well do learners achieve?

 Self-evaluation is based on lesson observations, evaluation of pupils' work, interviews with pupils and an analysis of teachers' assessments.

Brief opinion of main strengths of learners achievement awarded: 1

Grade

KS1

By the end of Y2, the children can discuss some Christian celebrations, such as Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter, very well.

KS1 children are able to describe the Hindu religious follower's pattern of worship, referring to the practices and artefacts. The children's visit to observe a Hindu follower worshipping, provided them with a greater understanding.

Children deal with 'investigative' tasks in a confident and mature manner. KS2

They show a very good knowledge of Christianity and other religions.

They are able to respond to religious concepts, e.g. 'The Creation' through music and paintings.

The older children can explain many of the features that characterise various religions.

AaGD are a key feature of lessons presented at the school and this working approach leads to improved standards.

All the children who attend the school are considerate towards others, and through our links with Shreekandepur school in Nepal, they are familiar with the notion of belonging to a global family.

What aspects will be focused upon over the next two years?

Purchase more resources

Provide greater depth to lessons so as to deal with religion, and put less emphasis on factual learning.

Spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.
