## PWLLHELI HARBOUR CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE 15/10/19

#### 1. ELECTION OF CHAIR

**RESOLVED** to re-elect Councillor Hefin Underwood as Chair of this Committee for the year 2019/20.

#### 2. ELECTION OF VICE-CHAIR

RESOLVED to re-elect Councillor Peter Read as Vice-chair of this Committee for the year 2019/20.

#### 3. APOLOGIES

Apologies were received from Councillor Peter Read, David Dewsbury (Pwllheli Marina Berth Holders' Association), and Alwyn Roberts (RNLI).

#### 4. DECLARATION OF PERSONAL INTEREST

No declarations of personal interest were received from any members present.

#### 5. URGENT ITEMS

There were no urgent items.

#### 6. MINUTES

The Chair signed the minutes of the previous meeting of this Committee, held on 26 March 2019, as a true record.

A request was made for the results of the hydrographic survey conducted in March 2019 to be shared with members.

#### 7. UPDATE ON HARBOUR MANAGEMENT MATTERS

- (a) A report was presented by the Maritime and Country Parks Officer and the Harbour Manager giving a brief update to the Committee on harbour matters for the period from March 2019 – October 2019. Attention was drawn to the following main points:
  - That a detailed inspection of Pwllheli's navigational aids was to be undertaken by Trinity House Lighthouse Authority inspectors in October 2019. The officers did not foresee any issues.

- That developments such as a new weather station, web cameras and upgrading broadband improved customers' access to timely information
- That Parking and Launching companies were launching a number of boats without displaying appropriate PW and PC registration stickers. It was suggested that the Maritime Traders Association representative should discuss with the companies and encourage them to register
- That Hafan and Harbour customers had welcomed the self-service facility for red diesel fuel. Despite this, following a consultation and the action of the European Union Justice Court regarding diesel fuel used in private pleasure boats, and the decision that the UK would not be able to supply red diesel; it was possible that Hafan would be required only to provide a white diesel supply in the future. If any changes occurred, officers would notify users at once.
- That maintenance work on the North Quay had become more difficult over the last few years, with a lack of resources, funding and staff to complete the necessary works. Officers were urged to give due attention to the area and to hold discussions with the Highways and Municipal Department regarding the sharing of responsibilities for maintenance work.
- Reference was made to a brief summary of the Harbour and Hafan's budgets and current financial situation up to the end of September 2019.
- It was recommended that the Hafan Pwllheli and Outer Harbour fees should be raised by 2% for 2020. The recommendation was accepted.
- It was recommended that daily launching fees should be increased from £10 to £15. It was highlighted that launching fees had not increased in over 18 years, and that this increase would be a boost to increasing income. It was reiterated that there would be no amendments to the other fees. The recommendation was accepted with a request for officers to encourage users to register and use the service.
- The number of boats stored onshore over a number of years had added to the boat storage problem. It was suggested that the situation be reviewed, with consideration given to charging rent depending on the length of the 'onshore stay' period.
- That the Hafan's accounting system was now based at the Gwynedd Council Income Department, Caernarfon. As a result, it was reported that it would be possible to cancel the additional fee of 5% for the cost of an annual mooring in the Hafan by direct debit payments.
- That work had now commenced on the new RNLI lifeboat station. It was reported that Wynne Construction was responsible for this development. It was reiterated that this would be a new and exciting attraction for the local area.
- The British Dragon Association event and the Jester Challenge had been successful.
- An update was received on Plas Heli events, in which it was reported that 1060 competitors had taken part in events; eight major competitions had been held; and that the Sailing Association had 31 young members (four of whom represented Wales). Eight weddings and 18 funerals / funeral teas had been held; between three and five meetings were held weekly by various associations; 27 members of staff worked there at busy times. It was agreed that Plas Heli was certainly a boost to the local economy. The Pwllheli Sailing Club representative noted that landscaping work had been completed for the beach car park and the quay, along with drainage improvement works; and that three flagpoles were to be moved to the Plas Heli entrance to add colour. It was suggested that more signs were needed to direct visitors / residents to the café.

#### **RESOLVED** to note and accept the report.

#### 8. UPDATE ON SAFETY CODE AND DREDGING MATTERS

#### • Port Marine Safety Code

Following the Consultative Committees' decision that an item on the Safety Code was to be a standing item on the agenda of every meeting of the Consultative Committees, an update was received on safety code matters. It was explained that the Maritime and Country Parks Service reviewed the Safety Code for the municipal harbours of Gwynedd on a regular basis to ensure that all safety systems at the harbours complied with the requirements of the code, the expectations of customers; and conformed to Health and Safety requirements.

Members were reminded that the Maritime and Coastguard Agency's Chief Auditor had carried out a follow-up review of the safety procedures and systems at Gwynedd's municipal harbours in March 2019. It was confirmed that the Council conformed to expectations. It was highlighted that no issue or cause of concern had been submitted for the attention of the service by Members of the Harbour Committee in 2019, to date, in relation to the Harbour's statutory responsibilities and duties.

#### • Dredging

Following an invitation to tender on Sell2Wales, it was reported that the work of restoring Grwyn y Crud had been offered to the Jennings company for approximately £225,000. It was noted that, despite completing the necessary preparatory work for submitting an application for a Marine Licence to Natural Resources Wales, the licence had not been received (although a draft of the confirmation had been received). Members were reminded that it was essential to receive a Marine Licence as the footprint of the groyne extended beyond the existing footprint. It was noted that there was no intention to extend the nose of the groyne (this would mean additional costs and a time restriction of up to 10 years). It was added that the development was well designed and that the news was encouraging. The original groyne was to be demolished, and the new groyne built of stone.

In response to the plan, disappointment was expressed that there was no way of structuring and extending the nose of the groyne, as this would be an ideal solution, in accordance with the true need. Although it was accepted that there was a need for the work to commence, it was also suggested that there should be an effort to forward-plan for a long-term solution. It was proposed that the Assembly Member Dafydd Elis Thomas, Deputy Minister for Culture, Sport and Tourism (Dwyfor and Meirionnydd constituency) should be contacted to draw attention to Natural Resources Wales' strict regulations, along with obstacles in environmental legistlation and policies preventing the construction of effective groynes. It was reiterated that the Harbour was a valuable resource to attract tourists into the area, which was of economic benefit to the County.

#### • Distillation Lagoon

It was noted that around 18,000 cubic metres of material had been dredged from the harbour basin and channel, and that alternative methods of sediment disposal would need to be considered before starting the next campaign.

#### • Dredging Work

It was noted that the 'Royal Smals' company had completed the dredging work in the navigation channel and in the Hafan/Plas Heli basin. It was reported that the price for the work was £140,000, and that the company had worked in an effective and convenient manner, without impacting upon the harbour's operations in any way.

#### Sand Mound

It was reported that the sand mound near the Harbour entrance was almost full and that it was not possible to undertake any substantial additional dredging work until the sand and gravel had been removed from the site. It was noted that the Council was

in the process of advertising opportunities for companies to purchase the sand through Sell2Wales. It was also noted that discussions had been held with Natural Resources Wales regarding the relocation of the sand to the nearby beaches of Abererch and Traeth Crugan. It was added that Gwynedd Council would have to move the sand should there be a decision to do so.

#### **RESOLVED** to note and accept the reports.

#### 9. REVIEW OF PWLLHELI HAFAN AND HARBOUR

An update was given by the Senior Manager – Economy and Community on the management model review for the Harbour and Hafan. It was noted that, despite the work schedule having slipped somewhat, Strategic Leisure had now completed the report and its main recommendations received. It was reported that those recommendations were being discussed with the Council's Legal and Property Departments. The next step would be to arrange meetings with those organisations who had contributed to the review, in order to discuss the main conclusions.

An extraordinary meeting of the Consultative Committee to receive a presentation on the main conclusions was proposed and seconded.

**RESOLVED** to accept the information and to request that the Department arrange a meeting with the Members of the Consultative Committee to receive the main conclusions of the review

#### 10. DATE OF NEXT MEETING

## Introduction.

As a reminder, the Committees main function is to consider, discuss and advise on matters relating to the management, safety and development of the Harbour and to receive Member's observations on matters relating to Pwllheli Harbour which includes all aspects on navigation and harbour safety.

The purpose of this report is to provide a brief update for the attention of the Committee on harbour matters for the yearly period ending March 2021, and also in order to receive feedback from the members on safety matters and the operational matters of the Harbour. It is regrettable that the March and October 2020 meetings had to be postponed as a consequence of the Coronavirus epidemic.

## Port Marine Safety Code.

The Port Marine Safety Code ('PMSC') sets out a national standard for every aspect of port marine safety. Its aim is to enhance safety for everyone who uses or works in the port marine environment. It applies to all Statutory Harbour Authorities.

The Code represents good practice as recognised by a wide range of industry stakeholders and Gwynedd Council understands that a failure to adhere to good practice may be indicative of a harbour authority being in breach of certain legal duties. It is necessary for the Service to receive the comments and views of Consultative Committee Members on the suitability of the Port Marine Safety Code and to regularly receive observations on its contents, in order that it may be reviewed as relevant to the harbour activities, navigational aids, suitability of by-laws, safety matters and general day to day work at Pwllheli Harbour.

Following a thorough inspection of the Gwynedd Harbours Port Marine Safety Code and its associated safety management system by examiners from the Maritime and Coastguard agency last year, the Service intend to send a letter of compliance with the code to the Maritime and Coastguard Agency. This will be completed after an annual external audit of the safety management system has been undertaken by the Designated Person.

## Dredging

The combined dredging contract which includes the dredging of the east basin at Doc Fictoria in Caernarfon and the dredging work for the approach channel at Pwllheli harbour has been awarded to Royal Smalls. The company was also involved in the previous dredging campaign at Pwllheli.

The contract was due to commence in January 2021 but due to the current International C-19 emergency, restrictions imposed on movements and travelling has impacted on the work programme significantly. The Maritime Unit is in regular contact with the Consultants and with the contractors in order to gauge what can likely be achieved in 2021. At present, the possibilities are that work may be able to commence at Caernarfon during April and at Pwllheli towards the end of April to early May. We will advise all stakeholders of developments as travelling restrictions are amended.

With regards to Pwllheli, the existing original Stilling Lagoon has a remaining capacity of 4,000 m<sup>3</sup>. The aim is to remove 10,000 m<sup>3</sup> from the approach channel. Some siltation will be able to settle in the adjoining lagoon on route to the exiting **Leggeris** pipeline.

Material dredged by cutter suction from nearer to the harbour entrance will be deposited on land which is used to store material dredged from the harbour entrance. A separate stilling lagoon will be created by using existing material and water will discharge into the harbour from the temporary lagoon.

It has been assessed that this material will be suitable for dewatering in this area due to size and weight of particles.

Additional work on removing sand and heavier material from the harbour entrance will be undertaken in April using land based machinery.

## Financial Matters.

A brief summary of the Hafan and harbour budget and current financial situation will be presented at the meeting. The Coronavirus epidemic has had major impact on the income gained from the harbour. In accordance with the instructions of the Cabinet of Gwynedd Council, a reduction in the mooring fee was applied for a period within the 2020-2021 financial year.

During 2020/21 it was necessary to commit financial resources for the following;

Maintenance of navigational aids and beacons

Inspection and maintenance of pontoon and mooring facilities

Maintenance and operation of the of machinery and boats

Maintenance of land, structures and street furniture

Maintenance and purchase of tools and equipment including PPE safety equipment

## Fees and Charges. 2021/22.

The Service currently awaits confirmation with regard to the prospective fees and charges for Hafan and Pwllheli Harbour together with the Powerboat and Personal Watercraft launching fees for 2021/22 season. It is anticipated that the Hafan fees will remain at standstill with 0% increase but with electricity charges rising by 4%. Harbour fees will rise by inflation at 2%. Launching and registration fees will remain standstill following 100% increase in 2020/21. There will be increases in land storage, visiting boats and winter berthing as noted in the draft list of fees and charges. The Park and Launch permit will be subject to review in 2021 and charges will possibly amended to reflect the use of the facility and the need to contribute towards harbour maintenance.

## **Operational Items**

All Aids to Navigation within Pwllheli Harbour are working and are all on station. Trinity House recently inspected all Aids to Navigation and confirmed that all was in accordance with their requirements.

The Pwllheli Fairway Buoy will be changed for the summer Fairway Buoy during the next month; this buoy is of a larger diameter to the winter buoy. During the summer months the winter buoy will be serviced ready for deployment in October. Seasonal Speed Limit marker buoys will be in position by the inner harbour entrance in preparation for the 1<sup>st</sup> May 2021.

There are no 'Notice to Mariners' currently in operation in Pwllheli Harbour.

### Fuel Quay

Self Service Unit/Red Diesel - Since the last Harbour Consultative meeting in October 2019 we still await guidance from HMRC regarding the sale of Red Diesel to 'pleasure craft'. Therefore we will continue with the HMRC recommended 60/40 split until we receive further direction from the HMRC on this issue.

### **Maintenance**

Winter maintenance work has continued with power washing of the pontoons, landscape maintenance together with other essential works to ensure that the harbour and marina are to the required and expected standard.

### **Staffing**

After over thirty years of valued service the Assistant Manager for Hafan Pwllheli retired in January. The Maritime Unit we would like to take this opportunity to wish Mr Keith Williams and his wife Margaret well for the future and to thank Mr Keith Williams for his dedication to Hafan and Pwllheli harbour during the last thirty years.

There are currently two vacant posts at Pwllheli, and it is anticipated that two new appointments will be confirmed in the coming weeks in preparation for the summer season. Two staff members remain on long term absence due to health reasons. Both have been absent for over six months.

### Annual Harbour/Hafan Statistics

Details of the Hafan and Harbour statistics for 2020/21 are attached to the report.

<u>Berth renewals</u> – We expect to have a clearer indication of the take up for annual Pontoon berths by mid-April.

**Boat hoist/storage ashore** – The Hafan boat hoist utilisation seems to be steady but as reported at the last Harbour meeting, land space for the storing of vessels ashore is at capacity. The storage area will remain at capacity until late April early May when boats will hopefully be returning to the water. This year we have introduced an additional fee whereby any vessel laying ashore for more than a two-year continuous period will see their storage ashore fee increase.

It is hoped that this will encourage owners of vessels to prepare their boats for the water or make alternative arrangements for long term storage. This we hope will release much needed space ashore for current annual berth holders.

#### **Other matters**

New Weather station - The weather station is now functioning and operational and is available on the Hafan Pwllheli website for those intending to observe the weather live at Hafan Pwllheli. This can also be downloaded as a phone app.

<u>Web Cam</u> – Due to the pandemic there has been a delay in the installation of the web cams at Hafan. Once installed and operational the three cameras will eventually be linked to the Hafan website and will enable viewing of live images of the Hafan/Harbour and the channel entrance via internet browser.

<u>Powerboat/jet ski registrations</u> - all registrations should be available <u>on-line</u> and boat owners will be required to register their vessels and make  $\alpha$  using the on line facility.

<u>Lifeboat Station</u> – the new Pwllheli Lifeboat Station building has been completed and the new tractor and carriage have been installed. We understand that the new Lifeboat is due to arrive in April and will shortly commence sea trials and crew training.

## <u>Covid-19</u>

The year of 2020 has been a very difficult year for everyone and there is still some uncertainty as to what 2021 may bring. The Maritime Unit is striving to ensure protection to customers and staff during these very difficult and trying times. The Harbour as a whole has been open throughout the winter and continues to function in accordance with Wales Government guidelines.

**Boat Keys** – in previous years boat keys have been stored at the marina office if requested by boat owners. This facility would enable contactors to collect the owners' keys from the Hafan reception. This has been operationally difficult as this required for the marina office to be available at all times.

In order to reduce the staffing requirement and as a further measure to protect the marina staff and customers it has been decided that customers' keys can no longer be retained at the marina office.

The Maritime Unit will be ensuring that local contractors are made aware of this change which will come into force on the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2021.
