1. <u>APPLICATION RECEIVED</u>

- 2. An application is appended for a premises licence for B&M, Stryd Madog, Porthmadog, LL49 9BU from B&M Retail Limited. B&M Retail, formed in 1976 now operate a chain of over 500 shops across England, Wales and Scotland. The shops offer a wide range of home goods, a mix of food and hardware, of a good quality but at affordable prices.
- 2.1 The applicant is requesting the right to sell alcohol to customers for consumption off the premises.
- 2.2 The officers of the Licensing Authority are satisfied that there is sufficient evidence that the application has been submitted in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and the relevant regulations, and is therefore valid.
- 2.3 Observations were received on the application and, therefore, it has been referred to a hearing of this Sub-committee for a decision.

3. <u>Measures recommended by the applicant to promote the licensing objectives</u>

The measures recommended by the applicant in the application's operating schedule include the following -

- CCTV will be provided on the trading area and cash tills
- B&M will keep in contact with police officers regarding any matters relating to the site
- The floor area for displaying 'alcohol for sale' will be no more than 10% of the trading area
- Plain-clothed security staff will be employed on site by the Licence Holder as needed
- Instruct staff that they cannot sell alcohol to any individual believed to be drunk
- Notices to be displayed inside the site declaring that it is an offence for anyone under 18 years old to buy alcohol
- Notices to be displayed inside the property stating that the Challenge 25 policy is in place
- The staff will do their best to stop B&M customers loitering and causing a nuisance in the area outside the shop, and people who refuse to move on will be subject to a Police response in order to facilitate safe dispersal

3 Observations on the application

- 3.1 Observations were submitted based on the fact that there were concerns about the hours requested, with the intention of opening the shop from 7am until 11pm daily. There were concerns that the hours requested could undermine the licensing objectives, specifically, prevention of public nuisance.
- 3.2 A respondent noted that there is a history of noise complaints related to the site in the 90s, when the shop was opened for retail. The Committee was requested to give consideration to prevention of noise nuisance, especially considering that the opening hours of the shop are much longer than those operated by the Wilko shop.

4 **RECOMMENDATION**

In accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003, it is recommended that the Committee considers the observations of the respondents, and the response of the applicant to the concerns - and approves the application.
