| Dick Yorke | Ceinws, Machynlleth | Walked estuary side for at least 25 years no challenge or notices |
| Ann Foley | Brithdir | I have walked in front of this terrace since 1980. As far as I remember there were no gates and I don't remember seeing FP signs directing people round the back. For last 10 years or so I think I have probably walked along here at least once a month. I do not remember when a gate appeared at one end, but I used to open the gate and go through it. I don't remember being verbally challenged. Later the gate was locked. Because I am old my memory for when things happened is very vague but I can say that I have used this residential road without secrecy, force or permission for more than 20 years. |
| Mary Davies | Dolgellau | Has walked the path for 35 years. Never been challenged. Cannot remember when any gates or barriers were erected but it was only a few years ago that a gate has been locked and a sign erected - maybe 5-6 years ago. |
