1. APPLICATION RECEIVED

- 1.1 An application is attached for a premises licence for Sustainable Weigh, 13 Castle Square, Caernarfon, LL55 2NF by the applicant, Daniel John Hunt. The applicant is seeking a premises licence for a small shop located on Castle Square. It is intended to trade as a grocery that specialises in sustainable and local products, and alcohol will not be consumed on the premises.
- 1.2 The application is made in relation to the sale of alcohol off the premises.
- 1.3 Officers from the Licensing Authority are satisfied that there is sufficient evidence that the application has been submitted in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and the relevant regulations and is therefore valid.
- 1.4 No objection has been received to the application, and the applicant agreed to impose a condition on the licence, at the request of North Wales Police, that CCTV is installed. Observations have been received from the Fire Service which are mentioned in section three of the report.

• Staff training, to include a challenge 25 policy on alcohol sales, refusal of alcohol sale log and annual refresher training on alcohol sales.

 A CCTV system is operational on the premises and staff members have been trained on how to use it

3.2 Representations from North Wales Police

Observations were received from the Police and following a conversation with the applicant, he agreed to accept the following conditions on the licence:

Section M (b) - Crime and Disorder Prevention

- 1. A digital CCTV system will be installed to the satisfaction of the Police and the Authority.
- 2. The CCTV system will record and retain colour images of all times when members of the public are on the premises, for a minimum of 28 days.
- 3. Images will be surrendered at the request of the Police or Local Authority at the time the request is made and the premises will ensure they keep sufficient software available to comply with this condition.
- 4. There must be a minimum of one trained member of staff available to download evidence at the request of the Police or an authorised officer at all times when the building is open.
- 5. CCTV warning signs shall be fitted and clearly displayed in public areas of the premises.
- 6. Recordings of incidents must be kept secure for inspection by the Police.

• Section M (e) Protection of Children from Harm

The premises will operate a Challenge 25 policy

3.3 Observations from North Wales Fire and Rescue Service

Observations have been received from the Fire Service noting there is no objection provided that the owner has ensured that the emergency lighting of the fire exit is working, the fire alarm system has been serviced and is in operation and that fire extinguishers have been serviced and are up to date.

4 RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that this Committee approve the application - in accordance with what was agreed with the Police and in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003.
