On grant of the Premises Licence in 2005, conditions were imposed which were subsequently subject to an Appeal which was concluded on 27th January 2006. Since that date, following various formats of the Premises Licence, there have been periods of time when, the licence has been unclear as to the provisions of its operation but the historic restriction limiting use of the beer garden area are now set out not by way of condition but in respect of the times available for licensable activities despite, consumption not falling within that criteria. Application is made to clarify the position and extend the potential use of the beer garden. It is proposed that the recital contained under supply of alcohol on and off premises: "Beer garden (drinking only) Monday to Sunday 11:00 to 21:00 hours" Be deleted and be replaced with a condition under Prevention of Public Nuisance as follows: "There shall be no public access (save for purposes of emergency evacuation) of the beer garden between 23:00 and 08:00". It is proposed that the wording clearly identifies the permitted operation of the beer garden. It is proposed that use of the beer garden until 23:00 hours will not result in public nuisance arising. The addition of conditions so as to monitor potential noise levels are as follows. "For periods between 21:00 and 23:00 when the beer garden is in use, checks to be undertaken at hourly intervals and recorded, should noise levels be audible above background noise then, steps shall be taken to mitigate noise generated within the beer garden area" "Such records to be retained for a period of 6 months and be available for inspection to the Police and Licensing Officers." Additionally, it is proposed that the narrative under general at Annex 2 should be deleted providing no enforceable conditions but simply relates to the time of conversion of the licence in 2005. No application is made to alter the hours of operation, hours of licensable activity nor the conditions endorsed

upon the licence. It is believed that with the addition of the two further conditions, the licensing objective of

prevention of public nuisance can be promoted.

Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
