Appendix 1 details the main grants which have been delegated to each school in Gwynedd for 2016/17 - a total of £9.6million over and above the £74million delegated by the Council.

Pupil Deprivation Grant (PDG) 2016/17 £2,203,350 (2015/16 £1,977,450)

The grant is allocated on the basis of pupils eligible for free school meals. For statutory school aged pupils 5-15 years old, the grant is £1,150 per head and for the under 5 years old the grant is £300 per head. The purpose of the grant is to target pupils eligible for free school meals to improve standards in literacy, numeracy and to bridge the gap between the underpriveliged children and their peers.

Education Improvement Grant (EIG) 2016/17 £4,171,818 (2015/16 £4,368,705)

The purpose of the EIG is to raise standards. There is a specific formula for allocating the notional Foundation Phase element of the grant, with the requirement to work towards achieveing a 1:8 adult to pupil ratio in nursery and reception classes, whilst the ratio is 1:15 in years 1 and 2.

The remainder of the EIG is allocated based on 80% pupil numbers and 20% free school meals.

GwE provides full support to schools on their use of the EIG and PDG, whilst also having responsibility to monitor and challenge their use of this funding.

6th Form Grant £3,277,221

Of the 14 secondary schools in Gwynedd, 7 schools provide 6th form courses. The grant allocation is based on a combination of pupil numbers/number of courses, deprivation, sparsity and Welsh medium education.
